

First Sunday of Advent Year C

November 29, 2015

Expectancy! We have entered that period of the church year, Advent, where we are asked to contemplate what we expect from the birth of a Saviour. This was a question I asked at Ashfield Boys High this week. What did they expect from God? Their responses were :to be kept safe, to be loved, to encounter no evil etc. Their expectancy may encounter disappointment. They want God to place them in a safety bubble, free of trouble, harm, hurt, pain and disappointment. It's actually denying life....because that's what life is. Does this style of expectancy of God then cause them to disbelieve and blame God when misfortune or the unexpected crosses their path. How could God allow this to happen to me? Rather than the God who joined us in the messiness of the human condition.

We can carry this back to Mary's big YES to God's plan and that unaccountable pregnancy. No there was no protective bubble there. She was carrying the Messiah, what were her expectations of God? She trusted. No doubt there was a little local gossip, and what about that initial chat with her parents.... and with Joseph! However all three have been made Saints because of their connection with this amazing trust of Mary. She understood without fear realising that God had a greater plan.

The gospel today, with its apocalyptical style, almost resembles our world at present times, with war, terror and climate change. Where is God? We need peace! Through this Advent we will gain peace through following the model of Mary. Trust in God, his expectations are not yours. "Stand with confidence before the Son of Man" as the gospel of Luke advises. Live this moment, not regretting the past moments or fearing future moments, trust in God and peace will be yours.

Communion is a communal meal

We process to the table of the Eucharist to eat and drink. Just as a meal shared with others is not just about feeling myself by sharing companionship, so the Eucharistic meal makes us not only one with Christ but one with each other. You might have been taught to keep your eyes down when processing but it is more appropriate to be attentive to those around you and recognise that Eucharistic communion is not only a personal encounter but a communal one. The Christ of the Eucharist comes into our hearts and unites us all as one body. This is not the time for us to focus on the hosts left over or to focus on the tabernacle but to be conscious of the Christ within me and the Christ in each other. Immediately after we've all shared in communion is the time to think, not of my own needs, but those of our community and how Christ is challenging each of us to reach out to those in our church and our neighbourhood.
