

## Seventeenth Sunday In Ordinary Time - Year C

July 24, 2016

Today the gospel speaks to me of our connectedness with each other. We all share in the parenthood of God that connects us as brothers and sisters in that "family way." This week we celebrated the full life of our oldest parishioner Winifred Lynch, who at 104 went to God. We feel joy in the death of this woman of great faith, with the absolute certainty that she is being held in the arms of her beloved God as she was in the arms of her beloved daughter here on earth just before she died; but we also feel the loss of a wonderful mother and grandmother, friend and neighbour. Being born and dying are the common destinies for all humanity. For most of us it's that bit in the middle we call life that is the challenge. Jesus talks of that closest of relationships, the family, when he asks us to address his Father as Father, our Father. It stresses the family aspect of all humanity. And what Father would respond to child's request with what is not nourishing or fulfilling or bad. That fellowship also spreads to us, as co inheritors of 'your kingdom come'. How do I contribute to bringing the kingdom to reality? Jesus also speaks of the persistence that we need to keep asking, searching and knocking not just of God but in the name of his kingdom. Do we speak out about injustice that we see being perpetrated in our name? Do we get up to ask for 'bread' give us each day our daily bread for unexpected travellers from our friends with a persistent attitude? Do we welcome? Do we offer hospitality? Or do we keep our door shut! And refuse to share and break bread with brothers and sisters. It's a tough call to understand what is asked by Our Father. However, look to Jesus, he didn't hide from making the kingdom a reality for people ....he didn't build walls or tow boats back... he went to the borders to bring people in! Marguerite Martin

reception is recommended to be followed by all, so that Communion may truly be a sign of unity among those who share in the same table of the Lord.

When approaching to receive Holy Communion, the faithful bow in reverence of the Mystery that they are to receive. (General Instruction of the Roman Missal No 160)

Chasing Asylum exposes the real impact of Australia's offshore detention policies and explores how 'The Lucky Country' became one where leaders choose detention over compassion and governments deprive the desperate of their basic human rights. The film features never before seen footage from inside Australia's offshore detention camps, revealing the personal impact of sending those in search of a safe home to languish in limbo. Chasing Asylum explores the mental, physical and even the fiscal consequences of Australia's decision to lock away families in unsanitary conditions away from media scrutiny, destroying their lives under the pretext of saving them.


